Approval of the Agenda

Dr. Shuey moved to approve the amended agenda for the December 29, 2022, Board Meeting. Motion was seconded by Dr. Sato. Motion approved unanimously.

Public Comment (Public comment period is open and limited to two minutes)

Dr. Wheeler wished everyone attending the meeting Happy Holidays.

Dr. Wheeler asked the Board Members if the Iowa Veterinary Medical Association Executive Board Members would be able to obtain continuing education credit hours for their meetings. The Board stated the Continuing Education Application would have to be completed and submitted with the appropriate documents for the Iowa Board of Veterinary Medicine to review the same as any other meeting requesting continuing education hours.

Ms. Dorman spoke to the Board Members regarding the Veterinary Technician Iowa Code Task Force dated December 28, 2022; these are draft changes to Iowa Code 169. Ms. Dorman stated changes to definitions; changes to veterinary auxiliary personnel; the scope of practice, and veterinary assistants and students is being proposed.

Approval of the Open Meeting Minutes

Dr. Sato moved to approve the Open Meeting Minutes of November 17, 2022. Motion was seconded by Mr. Yoder. Motion approved unanimously.

Executive Secretary Report

Dr. Kaisand reported the Board's financial balance as of November 30, 2022, is \$41,103.37.

Dr. Kaisand reported there have not been any new cases of avian influenza for the past three-weeks. There were nine commercial flocks and two backyard flocks that tested positive. Most of the turkey sites should be completing the composting process. There are outbreaks in other states, and those states are slow to respond unlike lowa's response time to the outbreaks.

Chairperson Report

Dr. Burkgren reported the FDA withdrew the guidance document regarding the valid veterinarian/client/patient relationship because of COVID. The guidance document established in May 2020 removed the requirement for the physical examination for timely visits to establish a valid veterinarian/client/patient relationship will be effective February 21, 2023.

Correspondence

Morgan Guiffre - Vets to Pets House Call Service sent a letter to the Board proposing an amendment to the Valid Veterinarian/Client/Patient Relationship rule to include the ability to establish a valid veterinarian/client/patient relationship virtually via video-chat when indicated. Dr. Wheeler stated the Iowa Veterinary Medical Association is in line with the American Veterinary Medical Association and that a physical examination of the animal is needed.

Lola Michelin – National Board of Certification for Animal Acupressure and Massage (NBCAAM) sent a letter regarding acupressure and massage. In Iowa if an individual is diagnosing and treating an animal for a fee this would be a violation if the individual is not a licensed veterinarian.

Ms. Dorman stated the chiropractors are trying to legalize chiropractic treatment for animals. This was introduced to the legislature last year and was not successful in passing. It may be reintroduced this year, but it is not known at this point.

Veterinary Technician National Examination Scores 11/15-30/2022. The report is for the Board Member's information and no action is required.

Amy Martirosian (Gansemer), DVM – Clarification 169.4. The Board Members discussed Dr. Martirosian's inquiry and directed Dr. Kaisand to respond to her regarding each question:

1) Clarification of the terms "direction" and "supervision" used within the code. Does this mean that a licensed veterinarian needs to be directly watching over duties being performed, accessible within the clinic, or accessible via phone call?

Board's response: This is not defined in Code 169.4.

2) Is a foreign graduate allowed to prescribe non-DEA/regulated medications (i.e. treatment for ear infections, anal gland abscesses, etc.)?

Board's response: Direct supervision is required.

3) Under this code, is a foreign grad able to administer vaccinations including rabies?

Board's response: No only licensed veterinarians administer Rabies vaccinations.
