E15 Access Standard

Is Your Station Compliant with Iowa's E15 Access Standard?



The Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship is reminding you that the **E15 Access Standard**, passed by the Iowa Legislature in 2022, will go into full effect on January 1, 2026. Details about the impending policy are outlined in [Iowa Code 214A.31-37](#) and [Iowa Administrative Code 21-86](#).

The Department is encouraging all Iowa fuel retailers who have not received a waiver or exemption to start making plans to upgrade their fueling infrastructure now to begin offering E15 and ensure **compliance by January 1, 2026**.

REGULATORY ENFORCEMENT

The Iowa Legislature has authorized the Department to fine non-compliant, non-exempt fuel retailers **\$1,000 per day beginning January 1, 2026**.
